Program Aim

By acquiring scientific, ethical and empirical skills through the study of scientific knowledge related to disasters, recovery and revitalization, and disaster prevention and mitigation, we aim to contribute to the recovery and revitalization of disaster-stricken areas and to cultivate highly skilled personnel who can actively engage in disaster prevention and reduction efforts both in Japan and globally.

By earning these credits, you will be eligible to take the exam for Disaster Prevention Specialist (certified by the Japan Bousaisi Organization).

With an eye toward working as a Disaster Prevention Specialist, you can acquire the fundamental knowledge and skills necessary through lectures and practical exercises conducted by faculty members and practitioners. This program is available not only to undergraduate students but also to master's course students in graduate programs.

The Disaster Prevention Specialist qualification was born from the lessons learned from the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake. Disaster Prevention Specialists are key players in enhancing disaster resilience in communities to minimize damage from disasters.

Colleges, Schools and Graduate Schools Offering the Program

The programs for each college and school prioritize the enrollment of students admitted through Disaster Prevention and Revitalization Selection. However, there are also programs that can be taken and completed by all undergraduate students. The courses in the master's program are available for all graduate school students, however only students enrolled in the master's program of the graduate school offering the program can complete it.
